Senior Home Repair

H.I.T. Foundation is committed to keeping senior adults in their own homes for as long as possible by providing major home repairs, yard cleanups, minor handyman services and accessibility modifications.

Affordable Housing

H.I.T. Foundation owns and manages 59 rental properties throughout Preble County. The goal of affordable housing is to serve low-income households that meet attainable earning qualifications.

Homeless Services

H.I.T. foundation operates Preble County's emergency homeless shelter, which is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The shelter serves Preble County residents as a temporary housing facility for clients experiencing a housing crisis. Clients are served 3 meals per

day, and meet regularly with shelter staff and a case manager to work toward their housing goals. Clients are also expected to follow a daily schedule and must agree to adhere to shelter rules.

Homeless Services also operates the **Homeless Crisis Response Program (HCRP)**, which can provide assistance with rent payment and housing placement for those at risk of or experiencing homelessness. For more info on these services, contact the HCRP Case Manager at **(937)-472-0500 ext. 425**



Why:

Nationally, 50% of foster families quit fostering within their first year. With a dedicated Care Community's support, 90% of foster families continue to foster well beyond the first year. Locally, in August of 2021, 73% of kids in paid placements were placed outside of Preble County, This causes additional trauma to the kids and places a cost burden on the County.

Care Communities are groups of 4-8 people within a FAM who wrap around a local foster or kinship family with weekly prayer, delivered meals, child care, and other services to help meet their needs.



Get museum admission discounts with your EBT card!

It is important to remember that you cannot pay for admission with your EBT card. You will show the EBT card to receive the discount but you will need to pay the remaining admission price, if any, in cash or with a credit/debit card. *While we do our best to ensure accurate information, please check the destination website for more up-to-date information.*

Destinations near Preble County:

Cincinnati Zoo – general admission \$6/adult, \$3/child, \$1 for parking - \$40 memberships

You must have a valid SNAP card and photo ID to purchase tickets or apply for a membership. (Limit of 8 tickets purchased per visit with SNAP card.) Must be purchased in person at the Zoo. We have limited walk-up reservations available per half-hour time slot for in-person discounts. Walk-up reservations are first-come/first-served and not guaranteed.

Cincinnati Museum and Duke Energy Children's Museum - \$2 admission

Eligible recipients receive free parking and \$2/person Museum Admission tickets for up to 10 people when EBT, SNAP, or Medicare card and photo ID is presented at the box office. Eligible recipients can also receive \$2/person Holocaust & Humanity Center tickets.

Cincinnati: Taft Museum of Art - \$3 per person.

The Taft houses a small fine arts museum inside a National Historic Landmark built in 1820. Free admission for all on Sundays. Advance tickets REQUIRED.

Columbus: Center of Science and Industry (COSI) - \$49 per family, per year

If you have an Ohio Directions card, Medicaid card or WIC enrollment paperwork, you can save up to a lot of money on a COSI family membership! Instead of the full family membership rate, you'll pay just\$49 for a Family Access membership.

Columbus: Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens – FREE

Visitors who can show a photo ID and an Ohio Directions card can receive free admission on the first Sunday of the month between 10am and 5pm. A Medicaid card or WIC card can also be used instead of an Ohio Directions card. If you qualify for the free first Sundays, you also qualify for a discounted access membership. For just \$25, you can receive unlimited admission for a year for up to two adults and all children under age 18. This pass usually costs \$80!

Dayton: National Museum of the US Air Force - Free admission!

Dayton: Victoria Theatre Association - \$10 per seat

The Victoria Theatre Association offers \$10 seats through the Dayton Power & Light Company CHEAP SEATS program. This program provides balcony seats for select performances. This is not an EBT specific discount, so anyone can purchase them! Get the details on the Victoria Theatre website.

Income Maintenance – Determines eligibility for Cash, Food, and Medical Programs. You may also go to benefits.ohio.gov to manage or apply for Medicaid, childcare, food, and cash benefits. **Select Option 1 when calling.**

Work Activities – Helps customers become self-sufficient by developing a plan for work experience, schooling, or employment. Customers receiving cash and food assistance are required to complete these activities to receive their assistance. **Select Option 1 when calling.**


Social Services – Helps customers with emergency assistance, transportation to medical appointments, and determines eligibility for daycare services/providers. **Select Option 1 when calling.**

Child Support – Establishes paternity, establishes and enforces child support and medical support orders, locates obligors to enforce or establish child support and modifies existing orders. **Select Option 3 when calling.**

Adult and Child Protective Services – Investigates and protects children and senior adults from incidences of abuse or neglect. Can provide some supportive services to keep the children in the home and to stabilize senior adults in their own home. Select Option 4 when calling.

Salvation Army Funds – Funds limited to emergency needs of our community, which cannot be provided through other resources in the community. Must complete a Community Assistance Program Application, available at our front desk. Service priorities include one-time gas cards, medications, work related clothing, car repairs, furniture/appliances, and other services by approval of program supervisor. **Select Option 1 when calling.**

EHEAP/ Summer Crisis Program (SCP) – Eligible individuals and families in emergencies may qualify to receive up to \$175.00 in payment assistance to help maintain, restore, or initiate their utility services. In addition, those with a 10-day or less supply of bulk fuel may qualify to receive up to \$900.00 in assistance. This program



runs July 1st through Sep. 30th, or until all funds are depleted, and is funded through the Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program (EHEAP) by the ODSA.

<u>Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP)</u> - Community Action Partnership will gladly enroll eligible households into the Percentage of Income Payment Plan (PIPP) to help them manage their utility bills and maintain services. Through PIPP, customers are placed on a payment plan with their utility company according to their household income. This program is funded through the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) by the Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA.) Darke Rural and Butler Rural do not offer this program.

Emergency Services – Available to families in an emergency situation. The family income must be able to sustain the household. This program can assist with payments such as; rent to prevent eviction, utility payment to prevent disconnection or transfer services. Apply on the website, miamivalleycap.org.

<u>Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program</u> - This program provides continuing rental assistance to eligible families by way of a subsidy based on income. The Tenant selects a unit that is safe, sanitary and affordable. Funded by Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

<u>Transportation Services</u> - CAP Preble County contracts with Veteran Services, the Mental Health and Recovery Board, and Job & Family Services assist in transporting Veteran and seniors to medical appointments, and for work related transportation. Private transportation is available for a fee, by appointment.

<u>Camden Commons and Eagles Nest Apartments</u> - CAP Preble County manages the senior apartment complexes. These apartments are for people 55 years of age and older. Applications are available at the CAP office. All revenues and expenses for these programs are now internally generated and controlled.

<u>Home Weatherization Assistance Program</u> - This program is a free energy efficiency program designed to help incomeeligible families decrease costs and make their homes safer and more energy efficient. For weatherization services, please call 800-617-2673. There is currently no waiting list and there are a variety of programs available based on income and utility company. Call and speak with one of our HWAP Specialists today!

<u>Senior Commodity Program</u> is for seniors age 60 or above that are Preble County residents, and income eligible. Applications are available at CAP. Program is run by Shared Harvest Foodbank out of Fairfield. Distribution is the 1st Tuesday of Every Month, 1:00pm to 4:00pm. At CAP, 308 Eaton Lewisburg Rd, Eaton.



Home Delivered Meals – Meals are delivered to older adults at home. All meals provide at least onethird of the government's daily recommended dietary allowance. Meal deliverers check on the welfare of the client and are trained to report any health or other problems noticed during visit. Meals are delivered between 10:30 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, except holidays. Call for eligibility requirements.

Congregate Meals – Individuals age 60+ can eat a Congregate Meal between 11:00 am to 1:00 pm. in the Decade's Diner at the Preble County Senior Center for a suggested donation of \$3.00. All meals are Mondays through Friday. The purpose of a congregate meal is to promote health, reduce the risk of malnutrition, improve nutritional status, reduce social isolation, and link older adults to community services.

Transportation – Seniors age 60 years or better within a 50 mile radius of Eaton are able to use our transportation. Wheelchair transportation is available, and one escort may ride with each participant. If under 60 years and receive Medicaid, call Job & Family Services for eligibility.

Senior Companionship Program – This program helps community seniors stay in their homes and live independently by providing assistance with tasks of daily living and offering friendship and emotional support. Services provided include an in-home companion and/or a daily telephone reassurance call. Call for more information on these available services, or if you are interested in becoming a volunteer for this program or other programs.

Community Care Closet – Persons aged 60 and better who live in Preble County, and have an income at or below 200% Federal Poverty Guidelines may be eligible for items in the Community Care Closet. Medicine/Pill Dispensers for one week, 2x per day – Pill Cutters – Throw Blankets – Light Bulbs – Batteries – Flashlights – Fans – Portable Heaters – Liquid Measuring Spoons – CO2 Alarms – Non-Skid Tape – Radios – Whistles – Depends – Night Lights.

There are multiple ways you can give your time such as, delivering meals on wheels, companionship program (telephone or in person), dishwashing, leading a support group, and many more. 

The Success Program was created with the goal to remove non-cognitive barriers to learning (i.e. lack of food, shelter, medical care, personal hygiene etc.) so that children would be better able to achieve in their educational setting. The mission of the Success Program is to remove these barriers to promote school success, as it is recognized that education is the key to success for many children and a way for them to escape poverty. Another goal of the program is to assist parents with navigating and accessing resources, both resources to meet basic needs and resources to promote self-

sufficiency (education, employment, etc.). The core strategy of the program is placing liaisons in the school districts to help build relationships with low-income families, connecting them with community partners, and encouraging parents to become more invested in their children's education.
